

The tasting wines were in bottles that were brown-bagged. The point of the "Common Ground" theme was to discover (guess) what the wines of the tasting, including the warm-up, had in common. Lee's presentation explicitly stated the commonality that all the wines were from *V. vinifera* grapes, an obvious statement for many present, but several folks learned something new. To avoid giving away the point of the blind tasting until all the wines were tasted and the favorites voted on, the information on the wine list sheet was not revealed while the wines were discussed. Regarding what else the wines might have in common, there were many clever guesses, but none were close. After the votes were in, Lee revealed the "price per bottle" and, at last, the fact that all the wines were *box wines!* Lee gave the box prices and distributed the information sheets. Everyone enjoyed the tasting and were surprised that there were actually quality wines sold in boxes---and particularly pleased that the tasting was only \$8.00/person!
